

- Globally, 10,000+ K-12 English speaking international schools, 5+ million students, 500,000+ teachers
- Roughly 900 international schools in China
- Nearly 40,000 students
- Thousands of expatriate teachers in holiday abroad for Chinese New Year. May still stuck overseas.
- Slowly reopening at difference paces around China
- Many teachers and students stuck overseas



ONGOING CHALLENGESAND EVOLUTION OF SECTOR

Short Term

- Teacher supply
- Budget constraints

- Uncertainty surrounding enrolment numbers cancelled or postponed expatriate placements and foreign investment projects

Universities have lost their international students, and they may never come back



The loss of international students due to the COVID-19 shutdown has hit university finances hard, and it may be felt for longer than the global financial crisis, experts say.

"Those international student markets may never recover."

International education is one of Australia's largest export industries — worth more than \$35 billion per year to the economy.

In 2018, tertiary educators raked in \$8.84 billion in fees from overseas students — 26 per cent of their total revenue.
